





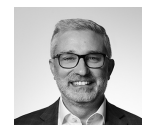

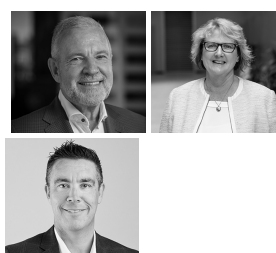

\$15.4 billion Non-stop North-South Corridor

- Construction work is underway on the biggest infrastructure project in the state's history.
- The finished project will deliver 78km of non-stop motorway between Gawler and Old Noarlunga, enabling motorists to avoid 21 existing sets of traffic lights between the River Torrens and Darlington.
- The Torrens to Darlington (T2D) project is the final and most complex section of South Australia's North-South Corridor.
- The expected completion date for the North-South Corridor is late 2031.
